



ANOTHER PATH TO PRODIGY WEEK PRODIGY SEARCH COMMITTEE

For placing among the top 500 in Prodigy Racing League™ virtual racing tournaments, you are eligible to be selected by the Prodigy Search Committee, earning a Prodigy Pass™ to attend Prodigy Week™. Here is what to know:

There are two paths to train and compete at Prodigy Week October 30 - November 1, and have the opportunity to earn a paid racing contract; they are:

Automatic selections:

Win one of the Prodigy Racing League virtual racing tournaments, and you're in.

At-large Prodigy Search Committee Selections:

We know there will be prodigies who don't win a PRL tournament, so we have assembled a Prodigy Search Committee to help us discover and select additional racing prodigies to be awarded with Prodigy Passes. For those who place in the top 500 of a PRL tournament, you may submit a video sharing why you are deserving of a Prodigy Pass, as well as answers to a questionnaire e-mailed to you. The first Prodigy Search Committee will award a Prodigy Pass to a deserving racer who competed in either the iRacing GR86 Cup or the PRL SK Racing Miami tournament.

Your video:

- One minute maximum. Think of this video like your elevator pitch.
- Focus on the information you share, and how you deliver it, rather than a beautiful setting for your location or cinematic quality.
- We recommend you record using a mobile device or a digital camera, sitting in your sim racing chair, office, or garage.
- Ensure a clean and non-distracting background, as well as your apparel.
- Upload your video to YouTube as "unlisted."
- Provide the link to your video in the last question of your survey.
- Submit your survey (e-mailed to you) by **Monday, August 7, 1:00 PM EDT (5:00 PM GMT)**.

The Racing Prodigy team will select 10 finalists from each group/tournament, sharing the submissions with the Prodigy Search Committee, which will reveal its selection for a Prodigy Pass, live on Racing Prodigy's Twitch channel by end of August 2023.

Each month, we plan to form a new committee to review the 10 finalists from each racing tournament that concluded the previous month.

If you're a racing prodigy, but you don't win a PRL sim racing tournament, this is how you could be discovered.

SURVEY QUESTIONS



If eligible, you will receive an e-mail and be asked to submit answers directly into a provided survey. Having the questions available to review allows you to prepare answers and work on your video for submission before the deadline.

General Info Questions:

- Name
- Date of Birth
- Game ID# or Username
- What country do you live in?

Real-World Driving/Logistics Questions:

- If under 18, do you have parental permission to attend Prodigy Week?
- Do you have a valid driver's license? If not, will you by Prodigy Week?
- If outside the U.S., do you have a valid passport? If not, will you have one by Prodigy Week?
- Do you currently have a racing license? If so, detail:
 - o What sanctioning body?
 - o Member since & Expiration dates
 - o Region (if applicable)
 - o License level (this varies between sanctioning bodies)

Gaming, Behavior, and Usage Questions:

- How long have you been sim and/or mobile racing?
- This year, how many hours per week, on average, have you spent sim/mobile racing?
- Which device did you use to set your best time attack time while competing?
- If you used wheel and pedals for your best lap in the PRL iRacing GR86 Cup competition, which wheel, pedals, and cockpit did you use?
- Describe your outdoor racing experience in a kart, road car on a race circuit, or race car. (*max 250 words*)
- If you exercise weekly, please describe your routine. (*max 100 words*)
